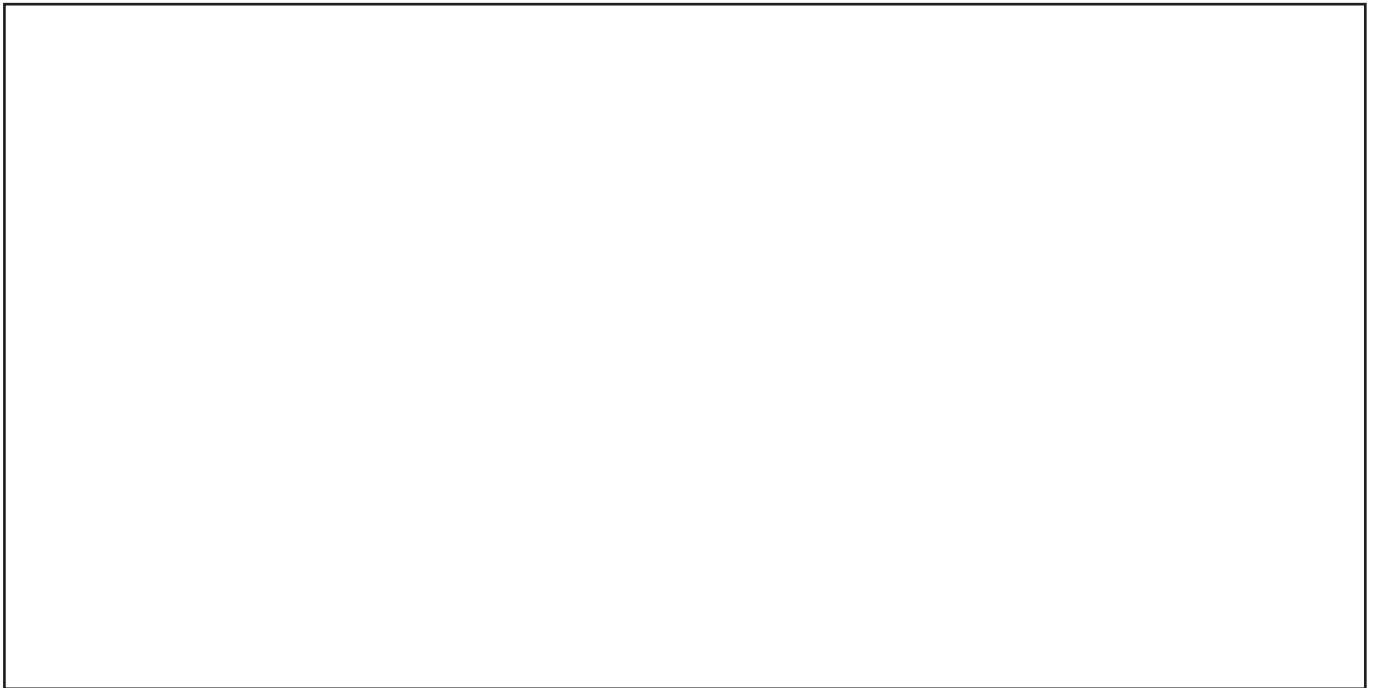


# Dig for Victory: Plan an allotment.

\*Plan an allotment for your Dig for Victory Club. Decide how to organise the planting of the seeds you have been given.



\*Here are some ideas of how an allotment may have been organized during the Second World War You can use these ideas to help you group your planting.

## Fruit

Fruit trees e.g. pear or apple trees

Rhubarb

Strawberry beds

Raspberry canes or blackberry bushes need a fence to grow up or canes

## Vegetables

Vegetables of all kinds, according to the season; for example: parsnips, turnips, Swedes, carrots, cabbage, Brussels sprouts, broccoli, cauliflower, peas, broad, bush and climbing beans.

Some gardens may have a greenhouse to grow cucumbers, lettuce, or tomatoes.

## Herb Garden

One section of the garden may have been kept as an herb garden

## Animals

During the war people kept hens for eggs and meat, and raised her own chicks.

## Compost

A compost heap would usually be kept at the back of the garden
