- Use the digital camera to take pictures of your garden and the gardeners hard at work! We would like to see photos of you planting your seeds, doing your weeding and harvesting your crops. Your schools Dig for Victory garden progress can then be shared with others on the website.
- Design a poster to invite people who experienced the IIWW into your school. Explain on your poster that you would like to ask them all about their experiences on the homefront.
- Set a date for your volunteers to speak about their experiences on the homefront during the IIWW.
- Interview your volunteers and video the process using your loan video.
- Visit the Manchester War Museum.
- Write about your visit to the War museum and send your writing to us to go on the website.
